Theme Summary:

The National Health Bill has sparked unprecedented interest, with the Parliamentary Portfolio Committee on Health receiving more than 100 000 submissions in response to the bill, demonstrating the enormity of the challenge ahead.

The gaps exposed and shifts triggered by the responses to the COVID-19 pandemic have exacerbated concerns. Alignment and industry cohesion are needed to achieve a National Health Insurance Bill fit for purpose and health systems strengthening.
